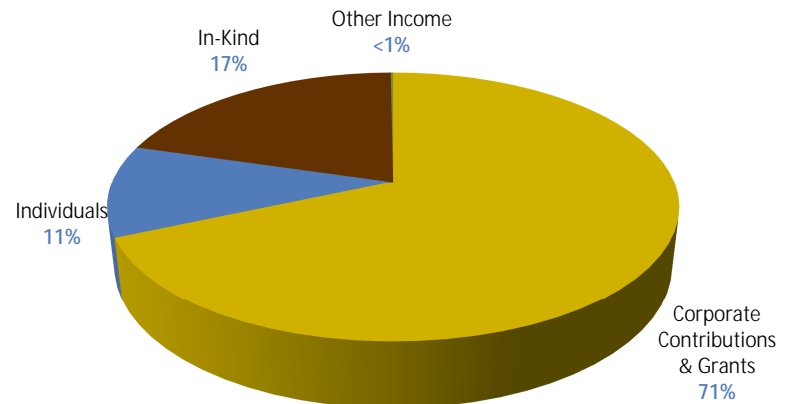
Partnership for the Future works to change the trajectories of its high potential students by effectively guiding them towards attaining their college degrees. PFF is a year-round program offering college preparatory classes, cultural capital experiences, college tours, mentors, and other scholastic opportunities. In addition, we recently established a new College Success program that focuses on guiding all of our recent high school graduates through their crucial first year of college and beyond. Our model works:

- 100% of the Class of 2015 successfully graduated from high school and matriculated to college.
- The 35 graduates in the Class of 2015 earned over a combined \$7 million in scholarships.
- Students consistently earn titles such as Valedictorians, Salutatorians and Gates Millennium Scholars.
- PFF graduates matriculate to colleges such as The University of Virginia, The College of William & Mary, Virginia Tech, James Madison University, Cornell University and North Carolina Agricultural & Technical State University, to name a few.

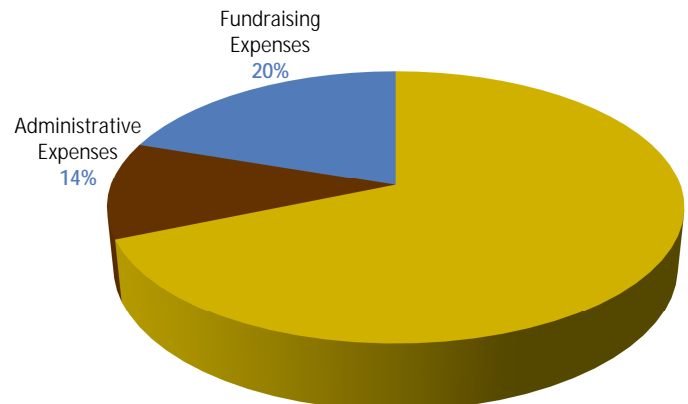
